

Flexible Community Services (FCS) Quick Reference Guide for Community Providers

Some older persons and persons with disabilities find themselves faced with the loss of continued health and safety and without personal or alternative community resources to secure needed assistance. Flexible Community Services provides limited assistance paying for medications, unforeseen bills, supplies and other items not covered by insurance. Funds are available through the local Aging and Disability Resource Network Partner.

Unallowable purchases: Good/services covered by insurance or other programs; goods/services benefiting someone other than the client or primary caregiver; reimbursement of goods/services already purchased or incurred prior to the request, including medical bills; vacation expenses, property taxes, credit cards, passports, and other goods/services that do not meet the allowable criteria. Other Helpful Tips:

- 1. FCS funds can be used for persons aged 18-59 with disabilities and for persons aged 60 and older.
- 2. There are no financial requirements to obtain assistance through FCS funds, however, an evaluation of a person's financial situation is conducted to ensure that use of the funds in appropriate.
- 3. Persons must be living in the community, not in long term care, to receive assistance.
- 4. Funds can be combined with other resources to meet the need especially for large purchases.
