Gift Card Scam: A person will ask someone to purchase gift cards as a form of payment. Be sure to only use gift cards as gifts and never as a form of payment.

Kidnapping/Arrest: Caller demands ransom money. Verify the safety of your loved one by calling them directly and ask the caller for details they may not have.



COMMON SCAMS

Sweetheart Scams: A person pretends to fall in love with someone to steal their money.

Can You Hear Me Now Scams: Caller will immediately ask "Can You Hear Me Now?" to get a person to say "Yes" to make it seem like they authorized purchases.
